What is the Finance Committee focusing on? Is this a question you ask yourself? Is it something you and your friends chat about during fellowship? If so, here is a quick update on what the Committee is up to for the next 4-6 weeks.

**BUDGETING for 2025!** This will be our primary focus in coming weeks. We will utilize historical information from 2021-2024 to help with determining the needs and expenses of our church.

We will be taking a bit of a different approach this year. Each council member is sharing the budget needs of their "area of responsibility". Once we have the estimated expense information we will be sharing this information with you. We are going to prepare several possible versions of the budget and share them with you November 17<sup>th</sup> at our Thanks-for-Giving meal before we finalize our 2025 budget for congregational approval at the annual meeting. The thought behind this madness is that we have a couple open staff positions and before we can look at filling these positions, we need to determine what we will be able to afford (i.e. Associate Pastor, Youth Director).

This approach will provide you the opportunity to help you plan for your 2025 annual pledge as a part of our stewardship drive that will take place in January. Together we will ensure East Side

## East Side Lutheran Congregation Council Mtg Oct 13, 2024

East Side Lutheran Congregation Council Meeting October 13, 2024

Present: Ray Schut, Jon Cisar, Carla Middlen, Brian Ensberg, Brenda Schut, Danielle Champa, Gwen Oakland, Michael Molland, and Pastor Layne Nelson. Excused Absence Todd Brower.

President Ray Schut called the meeting to order at 11:25.

<u>Opening Devotion</u> - Pastor Layne Nelson led the council in a devotion including input from council members and their prayer requests. He opened the meeting with prayer.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: It was moved by Carla Middlen; seconded by Jon Cisar to approve the minutes from the September 22, 2024, Council Meeting. Motion Carried.

<u>President's Report</u>: President Schut reported on the 80<sup>th</sup> celebration of radio ministry and the dedication of the sound equipment made possible by the gift of the Eckert Estate. President Schut thanked all the people who assisted in this and all events this last month.

<u>Pastors' Report</u>: Pastor Nelson reported on the events of last month and on upcoming events. Participation in senior adult focused events has been excellent. Other age groups, like parenting age, would be an East Side mission target.

Upcoming events include: the reception of new members October 20, third graders and Pre-K students receiving bibles October 20, Confirmation October 27 during the 10 am Reformation Day worship, and All Saints Day November 3. Worship planning by the worship committee has been completed for all services through the Christmas season.

<u>Financial Report</u>: Brenda Schut, Treasurer, presented the following financial report: Income has been less this year than last by the amount of the special financial appeal (approx. \$75,000). Attendance has also been less than in prior years. Congregational temple talks and our Thanks-For-Giving meal on November 17 will be financial education opportunities.

Treasurer Schut presented the partially completed preliminary budget and led discussion on many of the categories. The council discussed each one and offered input into the budget process. Information will be presented to the congregation at the Thanks-For-Giving meal on November 17. The council thanked her for the excellent presentation and all the work preparing the budget. It was moved by Gwen Oakland; seconded by Jon Cisar that the Treasurers report be approved. Motion Carried.

**Committees:** Stewardship & Visioning – Jon Cisar re-

ported the Stewardship Task
Force is hosting a handful of
small cottage meetings to
gather actionable ideas
relating to our mission focus
for 2025. Our mission focus
for 2025 includes: growing the
church by sharing the Gospel,
welcoming more young families, and expanding our
community outreach.

Education – Gwen Oakland reported Sunday School (under the direction of Jackie Swiden), and Confirmation (under the direction of Pastor Nelson) are going well. Faith statements are being presented by this year's confirmands during worship services.

Outreach – Danielle Champa reported 122 families (497 people including 240 children) were assisted with "Food to You" on October 3. Free will offering will be collected for Charis Ministries on October 20 with a giving jar at the worship services.

<u>Evangelism</u> – Brian Ensberg reported that during new member Sunday we will be receiving five new families into our congregation. Life Light has scheduled their outreach concert in the park across from East Side next Labor Day weekend.

<u>Fellowship</u> – Carla Middlen reported the next event will be Bingo with date not yet scheduled. The council discussed other possible outreach events.

<u>Property</u> – Todd Brower reported (in a written report) that a leaky pipe needed to be replaced. He is gathering information on possibly converting our boiler to a forced air system.

New Business – Committee Descriptions were reviewed, and several changes were recommended. It was moved by Brian Ensberg; seconded by Jon Cisar that the Committee descriptions with changes be adopted. Motion Carried.

The council viewed an interview with Bob LaRoy Folschow. The interviews are being conducted with congregational members for our outreach project, "A Portrait of a Spiritual Quest."

President Schut adjourned the meeting at 12:45 pm

The next meeting will be on Nov. 10 at 11:15 am.



In the 80's & into the 90's AT&T had a long-distance phone call war with MCI. AT&T was the giant in the industry and MCI was the new kid on the block...UNTIL...MCI launched it's Friends and Family Plan. It was a new approach to long-distance service. Under this plan, subscribers could set up "calling circles" in which calls within the circle were made at discounted prices — as long as both parties were MCI subscribers. I was on this plan for a while and I think it saved me money, but who really knows.

Today landline phones are a thing of the past for most of us. We don't wait until Sunday after 8pm to make a long-distance call because it's cheaper and I haven't heard a busy signal for quite a while.
