

#### In the know about Finances – January 2025

Due to the generosity of our East Side Congregation, we had a very good financial month of November. For the month, every category of revenue exceeded last year and every category of expense was less than last year. As a result, we are positioned to finish the year strong! Year-to-date through November we have a net surplus of \$15,432. Note that a generous windfall gift of \$30,000 was received during the first quarter of 2024. Also, the budgeted \$30,000 endow-ment distribution was taken in June. The capital saving money market account balance is \$73,486. This fund is used for Church projects and major property needs. Looking forward to 2025, a strong stewardship response will be critical for a successful financial year.

President Ray Schut called the meeting to order at 11:20.

Katie Chapman, Shetek Lutheran Ministries presented information on their ongoing capital campaign. She asked East Side to consider helping and presented several ideas that have been effective for other member congregations. The council thanked her for the presentation and took the request under consideration.

Opening Devotion - Pastor Layne Nelson led the council in devotions. He invited council members to review and comment on a book at a time Bible reading plan. He opened the meeting with prayer.

Secretary's Report: Carla Middlen moved; Gwen Oakland seconded to approve the minutes from the November 10, 2024, Council Meeting. Motion Carried.

President's Report: President Schut reported that the last six weeks have been extremely busy for all areas of East Side's ministry. He presented an idea of branded merchandise to strengthen member's pride of being a member of East Side. Sales could be online or in the Narthex.

Pastors' Report: Pastor Nelson reported on the events of last month. He presided at two baptisms and one funeral as well as outreach on behalf of East Side at a worship service at Trail Ridge Senior Living Community.

Upcoming events include Christmas worship, outreach events of a cribbage tournament, and bingo, We will receive new members on February 2nd.

Financial Report: Treasurer Brian Ensberg presented the following financial report: We had an exceptionally good financial month of November, with every category of revenue was up from last year and every category of expense was less than last year.

Outreach – Danielle Champa reported there were once again a large turnout for December 5th's "Food to you". Many volunteers from both inside the congregation and outside groups assisted.

Evangelism – Brenda Schut reported that we will be holding new member classes with new member reception on February 2nd. Thank you cards have been sent to volunteers.

Fellowship – Carla Middlen reported that Bingo will be held on Sunday March 2 between 2 and 4 pm. We will have many prizes for all ages.

Property – Todd Brower reported on bids to convert much of the older boiler system (mostly sanctuary) to a forced air system.

New Business – Carla Middlen moved; Brenda Schut seconded to set the Congregational Annual Meeting agenda for the meeting on Sunday February 16. Motion Carried. Discussion was held concerning the nominating committee and positions to be voted on during the annual meeting.

The council reviewed a proposal to update the Cell Tower lease. The cell tower company would like to update the tower. The lease had previously been approved by the congregation. The updates would bring in more money to the congregation. Moved by Danielle Champa; seconded by Brenda Schut to accept the proposal with Doug Jacobson representing the congregation for this update. Motion Carried.

Treasurer Ensberg presented updated Insurance quotes and an accepted bid for 2025 that saves the congregation money.

### Portrait of a Spiritual Quest

a new series interviewing ESL members, by ESL members

AUTHOR'S NOTE: This brief profile of a member of East Side Lutheran Church is presented here because these folks are in the pews and you have noticed them for an hour each week. You are often aware when they are in church and when they are not because their presence shapes a bit of your sense of belonging in this faith community. This story may offer an insight, a bit of inspiration or answer a question you've wanted to ask.



Many people are fortunate enough to find a job. Others are fortunate enough to find a career, but there are those most fortunate ones who find a calling – a vocation – and answer it no matter how taxing the call might be. They are the most fortunate of all.

Wayne Wosje, the current business manager, understands at 58 that he has been called to an ever-expanding set of tasks. He knew the territory; Wosje has been a member at East Side since he was a boy. He was confirmed here. And his three children were baptized here. And it is here he wept at the funeral of his 15-year-old son.

"I am still trying to find the good to come out of it," he says but he has found something else.

The day after his boy died Wosje told the men's Bible study of the loss and it was here that Wosje tapped into a river of compassion that has sustained him.

"I think of Devin a lot. I want him to know that and I want him to know I love him." At East Side, Wosje feels a connection with his son and a larger family.

"I think my strength comes from my family, the pastor and the congregation, my church family, helps me find strength."

When Wosje agreed to become the business manager, he expected the job would be about numbers. He has found that when there is a need East Side members "step up", as he puts it. And he is proud of that, but there has been that and so much more to his job than he first thought.

"We see three or four people a day that come here needing something. Often they request food". It is Wosje who digs in the kitchen cupboards and comes up with something." Some need money. That becomes a more difficult request because there is seldom cash to answer that need. Others just need to be heard because they have gone a long time being ignored.

"Does any of this benefit the church? There is no financial gain but we made a decision to stay in this neighborhood," Wosje says so this is what we do every day.

Yet this business manager finds there is more than feeding a hungry person or doling out a few dollars.



*"I pray with them,"* he says. That was not part of the job description either, but it is part of what Wosje can do in a church that cradled and sustained him when he needed it most.
