

PORTRAIT OF A SPIRITUAL QUEST—AMBER OAKLAND

AUTHOR'S NOTE: This brief profile of a member of East Side Lutheran Church is presented here because these folks are in the pews and you have noticed them for an hour each week. You are often aware when they are in church and when they are not because their presence shapes a bit of your sense of belonging in this faith community. This story may offer an insight, a bit of inspiration or answer a question you've wanted to ask.



Amber Oakland talks softly but sings loudly. For the 19-year-old student at Black Hills State University singing started when she learned to talk and she has been doing both ever since. And singing got her out of the country for her first trip abroad. She went with a college choir to Dublin, Ireland and that planted a desire to do more of that – in summers when she will not be working.

Amber Oakland plans to be a special education teacher when she graduates.
"I want to be there for kids who need a little extra help," she said. Just as members of the East Side congregation have been there for her. Oakland has been a part of the East Side Lutheran community since she was a baby. She was baptized here, attended Sunday school here and was confirmed here as well.
"People (at East Side) have known me for my whole life. They watched me grow up."

As a teenager part of the interest in helping others directly began when she attended Camp Shetek, a Minnesota lake camp northeast of Sioux Falls as a teenager. Oakland admits to being a shy person and finds it hard to make friends. Yet having a role to play could make a difference and the camp job was a good way to sidestep her reticence. After the first year there she knew she wanted to do more of this kind of work. For example, she found satisfaction working with special needs adults who attended the camp. Others had been helpful guides and





Growing up Amber carried another burden. She didn't know what to make of her faith because she could not comprehend why her father would have left the family when she was just nine months old. Her father had committed suicide. "I struggled with forgiving him," she said.

There were many unanswered questions, in fact. She struggled to understand "why he would do that to my brother and me." And the resolutions to questions became part of a faith journey, not to be dismissed but to work through. "A few years ago I found the peace and courage to forgive him," she said.

Her mom, a single parent, raised Oakland and she credits her mother's influence as an additional force shaping her desire to help others as a person and eventually as a teacher.

"Mom never missed my school events. She showed up for everything," Oakland said. All sorts of attention from her mother got distilled into one phrase: "she showed up."

East Side Lutheran Congregation Council Meeting March 16, 2025 Present: Ray Schut, Jon Cisar, Carla Middlen, Danielle Champa, Brian Ensberg,

Todd Brower, Brenda Schut, Gwen Oakland, Michael Molland, and Pastor Layne Nelson. President Ray Schut called the meeting to order at 11:25.

Opening Devotion - Pastor Layne Nelson opened the council meeting in prayer.

eport: Carla Middlen moved; Gwen Oakland seconded to approve the minutes from the February 9, 2025 Council Meeting. Motion Carried.

President's Report: President Schut reported on potential fundraising events. He reported that there has been positive feedback on the annual meeting. Many people felt the meeting was concise and informative. There were positive comments on Treasurer Brian Ensberg's report. President Schut thanked everyone for their work in making our congregation thrive.

Pastors' Report: Pastor Nelson reported that the many events of Lent are planned and ongoing. He just returned from time with family for vacation.

He discussed with council summer plans and potential continuing education plans. The three emphasis areas for the congregation were talked about. These are focusing on Christ centered worship and study; focusing on welcoming families and individuals with focus on reaching younger people; and re-engaging our existing congregation and engaging our larger community.

Financial Report: Treasurer Brian Ensberg presented the following financial report: Year-to-date total net position as of 2/28/2025 is (30,612) which is \$2,980 better than budget. He reminded the council that the budget is a target and a guide to where the finances should be at a particular time.

Our checking account balance as of February 28, is \$51,253. The surplus achieved at the end of the year allows us to sustain the variations on the budget each month.

The 2024 Life Light parking proceeds were used to provide camp assistance to East Side Lutheran youth. Carla Middlen moved; Danielle Champa seconded to approve the financial report from February 2025. MSP.

Committees:

Outreach - Danielle Champa reported there were 113 families for March 6 "Food to you". She reminded the council that April 27 is the date we invited Katie Chapman, Shetek Lutheran Ministries to present information on their ongoing capital campaign.

The Task Force met virtually on 3-4-25 to review the numbers and will meet at the end of the month in person with our GSB representative to plan next year's pledge drive as well as the end of year appeal for 2025.

Education – Gwen Oakland reported Sunday School and confirmation are going well. The Eggstravaganza will be held on April 12. There will not be an egg bake brunch this year.

Evangelism – Brenda Schut reported that there were forty people at the hocky outing. Over 100 bags have been picked up for the forty items in forty days outreach. She passed out some stickers to promote outreach by members.

Fellowship – Carla Middlen reported that Bingo was very well attended. She reported on the Wednesday evening mid-week meals. They are also helping with Eggstravaganza.

Property - Todd Brower reported on Projects that are ongoing. He reported on the total ongoing boiler expenses and discussion was held about the heating/air conditioning of the church.

New Business – Pastor Nelson reminded the committees that the 2025 Rumage Sale is scheduled for September 4-6. Please do not plan events on those days.

President Schut adjourned the meeting at 12:40 pm. The next meeting will be on April 27, 2025 at 11:15.



The Stewardship Task Force would like to extend a very hearty, "**Thank You**" to everyone for a successful and uplifting 2025 pledge drive! The "Together in Faith" drive surpassed the numbers from last year in every category! (THANK YOU to those who made generous challenge gifts!).

It might only be March but it is never too early to plan for summer camp! This is no April Fools joke, there are only two weeks left to sign up for the early bird discount! Sign up for Shetek Lutheran Ministries mini camp before April 1st to get a discount. This mini camp is for our 3rd and 4th graders. East Side has spots reserved July 20-22, 2025.
